- The closing date for applications is July 30 and the final selection will be made during August.
- Only successful applicants will be contacted.
- Those selected to serve on the panel will receive a pair of complimentary tickets for each production they choose to see in their area, subject to availability.
- There are over 200 panellists nationwide.
- The judging year runs from 1 September 2010 to 31 August 2011
- During the voting year, panellists send in forms for productions they think worthy of an Award. Voting forms are collated by TMA and shortlists of possible contenders are drawn up. These shortlists are considered by a panel of professional critics who then decide the nominees and vote for the winners.
- TMA is the pre-eminent UK wide organisation dedicated to providing a professional support network for the performing arts industry. Founded in 1894 by Sir Henry Irving, it is now an association of people and organisations throughout the UK professionally involved in the production and presentation of the performing arts. Its members include repertory and producing theatres, arts centres and touring venues, major national companies and independent producers, opera and dance companies, and associated individuals and businesses.
